Any individual or organization may buy an engraving to honor or thank a U. S. Veteran of Mountain View or other community who served honorably. Veterans are those who are still serving or have served, whether living or deceased, serving domestically, overseas, in peace or combat, regardless of length of service. Dedication is set for November 11, 2015. The memorial is at Eagle Park, 650 Franklin St.

Each 3" x 5" engraving consists of one to three lines, with a maximum of 17 characters per line (including spaces and periods). Engravings will be on black granite panels mounted on the columns of the curved wall at Eagle Park. A gold star will be added to designate veterans killed in action. To support the memorial, the cost for the three-line engraving is \$125 and is a tax deductible donation. HONOR OR THANK A VETERAN WITH AN ENGRAVING AT EAGLE PARK DEADLINE FOR ENGRAVINGS IS MAY 1, 2015



The City is updating the current Veterans Memorial near the 1924 Mountain View Union High School flagpole at Eagle Park, 650 Franklin Street. The park was built on the former school grounds in 1989, and contains a plaque honoring the school's students killed in World War II.

To give the current memorial more significance, the City will relocate two other plaques and add a final plaque to update the memorial and honor all those who served in the U.S. Armed Forces. The curved wall dividing the flagpole area from the rest of the park will be enhanced with military service emblems and granite panels engraved with names of veterans connected to Mountain View. Two park benches will be installed for the comfort of those viewing the memorial or attending ceremonies. The memorial will be dedicated on Veterans Day, November 11, 2015.

Any individual, school, or organization may purchase an engraving on the black granite panels to honor or thank a U. S. Veteran connected to Mountain View (or other community) who served honorably. Veterans are those who are still serving or have served, domestically, overseas, in peace or combat, regardless of length of service, whether living or deceased.

The cost for the 3" x 5" three-line engraving is \$125 (tax-deductible donation). Engraved benches and interpretive sign are also available. **Deadline is May 1, 2015. Consider an engraving for a birthday, anniversary, or holiday gift.**
